## EXPERIENCE OF WOMEN HAVING NON-THERAPEUTIC INDUCED ABORTION: A PHENOMENOLOGICAL FIELD STUDY.

**Abstract:** The aim of this interpretive phenomenological study was to explore the experiences of women who underwent non –therapeutic induced abortion. The study was conducted in a sub urban area located in the district of Colombo, from where seven volunteer women were selected as an adhoc sample and were given the opportunity to describe their experiences. They were subjected to indepth examination to find out why they chose non-therapeutic abortion as a solution to their particular problem and how such experiences affected their psychological and physical health condition. The study clearly establishes the multifaceted nature of the problem which has a significant relevance to reproductive health service delivery. These findings help to understand the necessity of legalized abortion services, the need for improvement in the existing contraceptive service accessibility and delivery.
